Events are free to the public. Both days are "Free Days in the Park" (no charge for parking). The Encampment will be open on Saturday from 10 am to 5 pm and on Sunday from 11 am to 4 pm.

The Dedication of the new Murals will be held on Saturday Morning at the Spokane House Interpretive Center

The Fur Trade Symposium will be held on Saturday afternoon and feature Warren Seyler, historian from the Spokane Tribe of Indians, Mark Weadick on Fur Trade Metis, and Fiddle Music of the

Fur Trade with Foy DeMoss.

Visit the Spokane House Interpretive Center then proceed to the recreated fur trade camps. Watch flintlock demonstrations & firing; visit the Spokane Indian tipi who camped and fished at this site; see flint & steel fire making; visit authentic camps and talk with traders; voyageurs; fur trappers; free hunters; engagees and Indian metis women "Daughters of the Country". Hear music of the fur trade. Enjoy the trading post featuring items for sale from the era.
